Call to Order

Chairman Colin A. Hanna called the meeting to order at 12:30 p.m.

1. Minutes of Meeting of March 25, 1999

On a **Motion** by Mr. Carson, seconded by Ms. Goren; the minutes of March 25, 1999 were approved as distributed.

2. <u>Selection of Consultant for Local Scoping of Kings Highway and Berkley</u> Road Intersection in East Greenwich Township, Gloucester County

Mr. Coscia explained to the Board that in order for Gloucester County to advance the reconstruction of Kings Highway and Berkley Road intersection in East Greenwich Township for federal funding, a project report, preliminary engineering, and related environmental documents must be prepared. Completion of these reports are required prior to including the project in DVRPC's and the States Transportation Improvement Programs. This project will improve the capacity and safety of this heavily used intersection.

DVRPC is providing administrative services to Gloucester County which is responsible for this effort.

The estimated consultant cost is \$87,000 in Federal Highway Administration funds under the NJDOT "scoping" program.

The Board unanimously adopted the following **motion**:

MOTION by Mr. Carson, seconded by Mr. Ware that the Board authorize the Executive Director to enter into, negotiate, and execute a contract with the consultant recommended by the Consultant Selection Committee for the

local scoping of Kings Highway and Berkley road intersection.

3. Authorization to enter into a Contract with William Penn Foundation for the Project Creating Geographic Information System (GIS) Capacity for Conservation and Natural Resource Planning

Barry Seymour brief the Board on this GIS project explaining that the proposed project will serve to support the William Penn Foundation by enhancing the use of GIS by area conservation organizations to identify those areas in need of protection or remedial action and prioritize their efforts. Through this planning and prioritization, funding can then be applied most efficiently and effectively to protect or preserve property.

The estimated cost is up to \$322,526 over two years, using \$269,914 from the William Penn Foundation and the remainder from the existing Work Program projects: Regional On-Line Information Network, Member Government GIS Support, Regional Technical Assistance, and Greenways and Open Space.

The Board unanimously adopted the following **motion**:

MOTION by Mr. Goren, seconded by Mr. Ware the Board authorize the Executive Director to enter into, negotiate, and execute a contract the William Penn Foundation for the project *Creating Geographic Information System Capacity for Conservation and Natural Resource Planning* in the amount of \$322,526 over two years.
