Comment/Question: There is no detail in this action item as to the characteristics of these bridges that are structurally deficient. These bridges are roughly 20 years old. Are the deficiencies related to structural integrity, or capacity? There are many other bridges on public transit routes that are known to have serious physical deficiencies because of deferred maintenance and age. Why are bridges on a relatively new expressway in need of \$130 million dollars worth of repair work?

Response: The bridges over the Expressway included in this rehabilitation project are 22nd Street, 21st Street, Ben Franklin Parkway/20th Street, the Free Library Pedestrian Bridge, 19th Street, the Family Court Pedestrian Bridge, and 18th Street. All of these bridges are original structures constructed in the late 1950's. The existing structures are non-composite prestressed concrete adjacent box beams with asphalt wearing surfaces supported by concrete abutments and a center concrete pier. The bridges from 22nd Street to 18th Street are in advanced stages of deterioration; both their structural integrity and capacity have been significantly impacted by their current condition.

The bridges over the Expressway that are "roughly 20 years old" are not part of this project. Those bridges are located east of the 18th Street Bridge and were rehabilitated/replaced during the 1990 Expressway Rehabilitation Project.
