

MEETING HIGHLIGHTS

1. Call to order

Co-chairs Elizabeth Voras of PennDOT and John Coscia of DVRPC called the meeting to order. All Task Force members were recognized and the April 10, 2002 meeting notes were approved by the committee.

2. FY 2003 CMAQ Competitive Program

Charles Dougherty described the upcoming round (FY 2003) of the DVRPC CMAQ (Congestion Mitigation and Air Quality Improvement) Program. Over \$12 million in federal funds (\$9.6 million for PA and \$3 million for NJ) will be available on a competitive basis for projects that can help the region reduce harmful emissions from transportation-related sources.

Candidate projects are to be submitted to DVRPC and they will then be reviewed for initial eligibility and merits. Projects that survive this screening process will then be subjected to an air quality emissions analysis. Several types of projects which are beneficial to freight movement are eligible for CMAQ funds, and the freight community is encouraged to submit candidate projects.

A subcommittee of the Regional Transportation Committee will help oversee the CMAQ program. The Goods Movement Task Force's Planning Subcommittee will be asked to designate one goods movement representative to serve on the CMAQ subcommittee. Ultimately, the CMAQ subcommittee will submit a list of project recommendations to the DVRPC Board.

The deadline for filing an application for the CMAQ program is November 1. Also, a public information session will be held at 10AM on September 27 in the DVRPC conference center to answer any questions about the application process. 3. Delaware County Highway-Railroad Grade Crossing Study

Ted Dahlburg and Kathy Belmonte provided a status report of a DVRPC study which will lead to the development of a capital improvement program for a series of highway-railroad grade crossings on a major CSX line which traverses Delaware County. The line carries 30 trains a day through intensely developed areas, and has 11 at-grade road crossings. There are many examples of grade crossing initiatives and programs throughout the country, such as the Alameda Corridor, the Seattle FAST Corridor program, Michigan, North Carolina, and Ohio.

Traffic volumes range from 3,500 to 18,000 vehicles per day at the crossings in the study area. One crossing, Main Street in Darby Borough, is very unique because it is traversed by a SEPTA trolley route. Eight of the crossings are state-owned highways, and most possess a full array of warning devices.

The next steps of the study will entail completing data and accident collection efforts and meeting with each of the affected municipalities. A technical analysis of various improvement scenarios will also be performed using FRA's GradeDec 2000 software package. This project is a two year effort through FY 2003.

4. "What If" Planning Scenarios

Jienki Synn presented a set of "What if" planning scenarios that are being used to help DVRPC frame its development of a long-range plan for the year 2030. This initiative has been undertaken with the participation of the DVRPC Board Policy Analysis Committee.

The "What if" scenarios are focused on questions that could influence the scope and nature of the regional transportation plan. The scenarios address the likelihood and implications of such occurrences as: the 2025 Plan prevails, the urban core repopulates, the regional economy intensifies, in-migration increases, and a "green" region is emphasized.

Next, the scenarios are to be simulated using regional and transportation demand models. The Goods Movement Task Force will be kept apprized of the development of the scenarios and the long range plan and of opportunities to provide input.

5. Transportation Funding: What the Future Holds

Senator Roger A. Madigan, Chairman of the Pennsylvania State Senate Transportation Committee, was the keynote guest speaker. Elected to the state Senate in 1984, Senator Madigan represents the 23rd Senatorial District which includes Bradford, Tioga, Lycoming, Sullivan, and Union counties.

The position of Chairman of the Senate Transportation Committee is very challenging. Pennsylvania continues to have more needs than available infrastructure, traffic volumes continue to grow, and transportation facilities have been converted into rolling storage for businesses across the country.

Fortunately, in Pennsylvania, the state source of highway and bridge funding, the Motor License Fund, is protected. Elsewhere, states are often forced to fight against competing interests for transportation dollars.

Infrastructure must be funded in ways that reflect the cost of and benefit of these systems to society in general. It is important to speak publicly about the importance of transportation funding in a unified voice. In particular, it is important to be heard regarding the reauthorization of the federal transportation bill that is due in 2004. An intermodal approach to transportation should be emphasized.
