

MEETING HIGHLIGHTS

10AM, Wednesday, April 18th, 2007

1. Call to order

Co-Chairs Don Shanis of DVRPC and Sharon Daboin of PennDOT called the meeting to order. All Task Force members were recognized, new attendees were welcomed, and the January 17th, 2007 meeting notes (which were emailed to the committee members) were approved by the committee.

2. DVRPC Grade Crossing Management System

A special introduction was given by Tom Woll, who is the Federal Railroad Administration's Program Manager for the US DOT National Grade Crossing Inventory Program. Mr. Woll observed that the US DOT grade crossing inventory is an important tool for MPOs and its planning partners, especially with the new emphasis on safety. He laid out how the information is collected by the FRA, and noted that it is the responsibility of the states and the railroads to keep the database up-to-date. He then proceeded to point out some of the inventory tools on the FRA website (www.fra.dot.gov) that may be useful.

Ted Dahlburg discussed DVRPC's development of a grade crossing management system that will initially focus on the Pennsylvania portion of the Delaware Valley. The key to this important effort is fostering cooperation among various agencies and the railroads. Mr. Dahlburg showed how PennDOT staff is collecting and updating crossing and "GPS" data at each location. He then indicated how SEPTA staff is performing ortho-rectifications of all of the rail lines, and is ultimately working towards the creation of a "linear referencing system" for each line. A follow-up on this important effort will be presented to the Task Force at the July 18 quarterly meeting.

3. **DVRPC Aviation Update**

Roger Moog, DVRPC's Manager of Aviation Planning, discussed recent issues and events impacting the Delaware Valley aviation infrastructure. Aviation activity and services are a vital aspect of the Delaware Valley's economy and an important feature of the region's freight network.

Mr. Moog discussed the physical constraints and need for growth at the Philadelphia International Airport. He also discussed the Federal Aviation Administration's new flight patterns and the opposition being raised to them in Delaware County. He also updated the committee on the status of the Willow Grove Naval Air Station, which once looked like it might be sold for development, but now is proposed to be retained for aviation purposes. A discussion surrounding the creation of a more regional approach to aviation, like that conducted by the Port of New York and New Jersey, followed.

4. I-95 Girard Avenue Interchange Improvements: Vine Expressway to Allegheny Avenue

Several improvements are under design for I-95 in Pennsylvania, one of the region's key facilities for freight activity. Elaine Elbich of PennDOT and Mark Rhoads of URS Corp. presented an overview of the improvements, with a focus on I-95 between the Vine Expressway and Allegheny Avenue. Ms. Elbich discussed the project in terms of the greater work going on along I-95, and was followed by Mr. Rhoads who detailed the proposal to reconstruct the I-95 and Girard Avenue interchange.

5. Freight Planning for the Wilmington Region

WILMAPCO, DVRPC's sister agency serving the Wilmington, Delaware region, and its consultants have just completed a draft freight and goods movement analysis. Dan Blevins, Principal Transportation Planner, provided an overview of the study findings and recommendations.

6. FHWA: Leading the Way in Freight

The FHWA is helping address the nation's freight transportation challenges through a number of initiatives. Tony Furst, Director of FHWA's Office of Freight Management and Operations, highlighted some of these, such as the *Framework for A National Freight Policy* and the freight professional development program. Mr. Furst is a retired officer from the United States Coast Guard (USCG), and Commander Spencer Wood from the USCG, Sector Delaware Bay, joined in thanking Mr. Furst for the leadership afforded by his office.
