Alison Hastings... Manager of the Office of Communications and Engagement, DVRPC Alison Hastings framed the meeting by explaining that the PPTF holds a session on the TIP every year, as it is one of three core mandated activities for DVRPC. Alison provided context about the process and gave an overview of the meeting's agenda.

Kwan Hui... Manager of NJ Capital Programs, DVRPC

Kwan Hui explained the TIP process, including how projects get onto the TIP, what kinds of funds are available, and the timing of various stages of the TIP process. She also gave examples of some recent TIP projects, to give a sense of the types of projects that can be part of the TIP.

Rick Murphy... Manager of PA Capital Programs, DVRPC

Rick Murphy spoke about DVRPC's Competitive Congestion Mitigation and Air Quality Improvement Program (CMAQ), which is a subset of TIP funding. He explained the timeline and scope of the program, who can apply, what types of projects are eligible, and how the selection process works, including selection criteria and funding requirements.
