

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Metropolitan transportation planning process





United States Title 23 CFR § 450.326: TIP required to spend federal \$

- Developing and maintaining the TIP makes the region eligible to receive and spend federal transportation dollars.
- Financially constrained infrastructure program
- TIP represents a list of priority federal and state funded capital transportation projects in the DVRPC region.
- Federal Fiscal Year (FY): Oct 1 Sept 30
- Best estimate of project schedules and costs
- Not a grant of money; based on reimbursements
- Not guaranteed funding
- must be consistent with LRP, CMP, and AQ
- multi-year program that is updated every two years in the DVRPC region





FY2022 NJ TIP: \$2.11 B of the First-Four Years (FY22-25)






FY22 NJ TIP First-Four Years (FY22-25):



% Summary by County and Transit Operator



Impact of IIJA / BIL on the Draft FY2023 PA TIP

Before IIJA / BIL:

 Faced with cutting \$750+ million from existing projects (over 12 years)

After IIJA / BIL:

- Existing projects funded (no cuts); Projects funded sooner
- 35+ new bridge candidates funded
- 10+ new county candidate projects funded





The TIP is multimodal.

- Bicycle/Pedestrian Improvements
- Streetscape Improvements

Overall TIP considerations

 Is the overall program consistent with LRP goals, and does it fit within the LRP's strategic financial policy?

 Does the TIP reflect a balanced program of multimodal investments across the region?

- Does the overall program support transportation equity and not disproportionately burden EJ populations?
- Does the overall program support and help meet performancebased planning and programming requirements?
- Do all TIP projects and programs meet funding eligibility requirements?
- Does the TIP reflect accurate project schedules and cost estimates?
- Does the TIP reflect local, regional, and state priority of needs?





TIP-LRP Benefit Evaluation Criteria




Equity Criterion:

- Broad definition of Equity (all IPDs)
- Incorporates scale (population)
- Penalizes projects that increase speeds or air pollution (added VMT) in communities of concern
- Used to inform project prioritization / selection


TIP is maintained throughout its life.







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FY2021 TIP for PA (FY21-FY24)




