FY 2010 Transportation and Community Development Initiative Grants (TCDI)



In Fiscal Year 2010, DVRPC awarded over \$1.6 million to 28 municipalities in Pennsylvania and New Jersey through the Transportation and Community Development Initiative

(TCDI) Program. In New Jersey, 16 municipalities received a total of \$1,000,000, and in Pennsylvania, 12 municipalities received \$620,000.

The TCDI program targets transportation investments in a sustainable way. Federal transportation funds are used to provide grants to local governments to create plans that link transportation

improvements with land use strategies, enhance established communities, and build upon existing assets. The adoption of the TCDI program set in motion the ideology of coordinating regional transportation planning with local land use planning and decision-making.

TCDI creates more livable neighborhoods in the region's core cities and

disadvantaged communities. Since 2002, DVRPC has provided almost \$10 million in over 100 grants to communities across Greater Philadelphia. Perhaps most importantly, these grants have leveraged hundreds of millions of dollars in additional public and private investment to support the revitalization of these communities.
