A Regional Visit Shed Analysis for Tourist Destinations in Greater Philadelphia

Burlington County, New Jersey

August 2024

As a part of its ongoing commitment to enhance travel and tourism, in FY24, DVRPC investigated regional visitation trends for select tourist destinations throughout the Greater Philadelphia area. Staff used the Buxton Scout platform to gather visitation data, focusing on sites in the region's eight suburban counties. Most of the selected sites are historical in nature, in an effort to highlight transportation access trends and needs at attractions that may solicit increased interest during the 2026 celebration of the nation's semiquincentennial, or the 250th anniversary of the 1776 signing of the United States Declaration of Independence in Philadelphia.

Buxton is a software service that gathers location and demographic data from mobile phone users, and provides analytic tools to evaluate consumer behaviors and preferences. The Scout platform can trace visits made to any location back to the home block group of the visitor. The project team used the anonymized outputs for each of its selected tourist sites to create an in-region "visit shed" by mapping the count of visits from each block group within the nine DVRPC counties.

The resulting analysis provides fresh context for tourism and transportation planning at the local, county, and regional scale. Transportation officials can use the data to understand where visitors are traveling from today and identify opportunities to enhance transit and multimodal access in the future. Local visitation trends might also reveal new submarkets in which tourism site operators or economic development planners could target future advertising campaigns. Alternatively, they may highlight known areas where existing marketing investments could be deepened. Organizers of the region's semiquincentennial celebration might notice overlooked assets that could deserve an elevated profile due to their ease of access by alternative travel modes.

The individual site analyses are compiled together by county and each receive a one-page profile highlighting their visit shed, transportation context, and other key data and information. Additional tourist destinations within each county are highlighted on their respective maps. Other sources consulted for these profiles include Replica and Walk Score.


