Agenda

I. Welcome

Patty Elkis, the Associate Direct of Comprehensive Planning, welcomed the Study Advisory Committee and reiterated the project's importance to the work of DVRPC and to the region.

II. Introduction to the Food System Study

Alison Hastings, the Project Manager, reviewed DVRPC's structure, work, and reasons for being interested in the Food System. Parts 1-4 were reviewed, with Part 1 being the main component of this SAC meeting and 2, 3, and 4 informed by the results of interviews and research conducted over the summer.

III. Part 1: Policy Network Analysis

Amanda Wagner, the Food System Study Intern, presented the findings of the Part 1 interviews, online survey, roundtable discussion and tours. One hundred and seventy-one (171) people contributed to Part 1 by responding to the survey through those different mediums. The findings revealed that the food system is interconnected, with diverse stakeholders having diverse needs and perspectives. As we look towards the future (and continue the study) we need to consider the implications of the global food system's technological efficiencies and labor specialization along with the fact that the region's advantages and challenges can be interchangeable.

Questions raised after the presentation referred to the increasing trend of non-food production in agriculture and the extent to which global components will be addressed in this regional study.

- At the end of the meeting, the Study Advisory Committee selected from the 60+ suggested Best Management Practices/Case Studies from outside the region to be profiled in the final report.
- A small sub-committee of approximately 8 people will be selected to review and give comment on each of the four parts of the report. The Part 1 subcommittee will meet on 12/12 after the SAC meeting to provide feedback on that draft.
- Commence Part 2: Distribution- including a Freight Analysis Framework of origins and distribution, literature review on "food miles," topical case studies and supply chain "trackbacks"
